

Paul Khairy, MD, PhD, FRCPC

Scientific Director, Montreal Heart Institute Adult Congenital Center Director, Clinical Epidemiology and Outcomes Research Montreal Health Innovations Coordinating Center Professor of Medicine and Research Chair, Université de Montréal

Dr. Khairy is an electrophysiologist and adult congenital heart disease specialist at the Montreal Heart Institute, where he is Scientific Director of the Adult Congenital Heart Center and Director of Clinical Epidemiology and Outcomes Research at the Montreal Health Innovations Coordinating Center (MHICC).

He is a tenured Professor of Medicine at Université de Montréal and holds a research chair in electrophysiology and congenital heart disease.

Dr. Khairy's clinical and research interests are centered on arrhythmias and congenital heart disease. He co-founded and presided over the North American Alliance for Adult Research in Congenital Cardiology (AARCC) and is the immediate past-president of the International Society for Adult Congenital Heart Disease (ISACHD).

He chaired an international panel that elaborated the first set of guidelines on the recognition and management of arrhythmias in adult congenital heart disease.

He has co-authored over 300 manuscripts in peer-reviewed journals, over 200 abstracts, 30 book chapters, and 2 textbooks.

Among Dr. Khairy's recognitions, he received the Quebec Young Researcher of the Year Award, the Quebec Young Professional of the Year Award, and Canada's Top 40 Under 40TM Award. In 2014, he was inducted as a founding member of the Royal Society of Canada's College of New Scholars, Artists, and Scientists.
